

**SUNDAY 18TH NOVEMBER**  
**CAIRNCASTLE TRAIL**

The Cairncastle trail offers views of the original Castle and Ballygally head, with many interesting place names.

Due to the unpredictability of the weather at this time we will be exploring Cairncastle via laneways and paths, walking boots and poles required. Register at Glenarm Visitor Centre at 2pm or Matties carpark at 2.30pm. Cost £5pp including refreshments in Matties. Walk duration 2 hrs.

**GRADE B WALK**



Trained walk leaders accompany all of the walks, and are equipped with drinks, first aid kit, mobile phone, map and compass. On the first occasion you register with us, you will be required to complete a simple health questionnaire.

Walks are graded to indicate the length, degree of challenge and level of fitness involved.

**GRADE A** are hill or mountain walks, often part wetland with steep inclines and descents. Walking boots must be worn on all Grade A walks or participation will be refused. Walking sticks or poles are also recommended on these walks.

**GRADE B** walks are mostly along paths and are less steep, however sturdy footwear must be worn.

Walk leaders may offer a more challenging walk for regular experienced walkers and a moderate alternative for others.

On all walks, warm waterproof clothing should be worn during colder weather and light loose clothing with a hat or visor is advisable in strong sunshine. All young people under 16 must be accompanied by an adult and dogs are not permitted on any walks.

In the interest of disease control of trees, animals and farmland, the organising committee and walk leaders will observe all Departmental Regulations and walkers must comply with preventative measures in place. The organising committee / walk leaders reserve the right to cancel or alter the route due to unforeseen circumstances or refuse admittance to anyone thought to be unsuitable for any walk.
